

How to connect devices to Xavier wireless

Laptops/Tablets/Phones:

Connect to the – **XULA** – wireless network and use your Active Directory account and password.

NOTE:

This account is the same that you used for the Housing Application and the Campus Portal.
Do not connect your laptops/Tablets/Phones to the **XULA-Devices** wireless network.

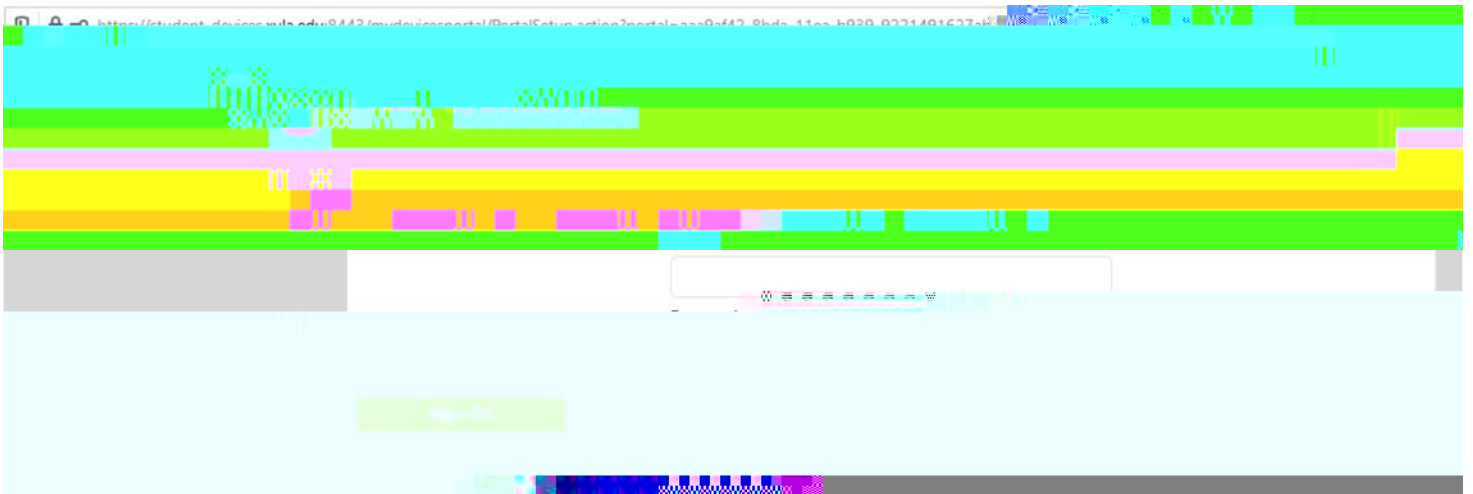
Gaming systems/TVs/Other devices:

On the computer/laptop/tablets/phone, that already connected to – **XULA** – wireless network

Go to *student-devices.xula.edu*

NOTE:

Log in with your Active Directory Credentials. This account is the same that you used for the Housing Application and the Campus Portal.



Click Add



x Locate the Hardware Address of your gaming systems/TVs, also known as a MAC address. At the end of this document is a listing of how to find MAC addresses for common devices .

x Enter a descriptive name for the device.

NOTE:

x Enter the Device ID (MAC Address) of your gaming systems/TVs

Note: If you are connecting via a wired connection you must use the Wired or LAN MAC Address. If you are connecting via the wireless, you will have to use your Wireless or WIFI MAC Address. You may have to google how to find your MAC Address for your particular device. It will look like this AA:BB:CC:11:22:33 or AA-BB-CC- 11-22-33. If you get confused about the MAC Address having a letter O or a number zero, it is a zero. MAC Addresses do not have the letter O in them.)

x Enter a description for the device

x Then click on submit

x At this point, on your device, connect to the wireless network “ XULA-Devices ” and it will authenticate.

How to find your MAC address on popular devices

Xbox One

Press the **Menu** button on your controller.

Navigate to the Settings page.

Select **Network**.

Select **Advanced Settings**.

MAC address will be listed next to Wireless MAC on the right hand side of the screen.

XBOX 360

From the Xbox Dashboard, go to **My Xbox > Settings > System Settings**

Select **Network Settings**

Select **Wired Network** or **Wireless Network** based on your connection to the internet

Select **Configure Network > Additional Settings > Advanced Settings**

The 12 digit MAC address will be listed at the bottom of the screen

PlayStation 4

Turn on your PlayStation 4 without any disk in the drive and wait for the menu to pop up.

Navigate to the **Settings** icon (located on the far left).

Select the **System** icon under the Settings menu.

You will see your MAC address listed on this screen, in the format xx.xx.xx.xx.xx.xx

PlayStation 3

Start the PlayStation 3 with no disc inserted

Select the **System Settings** icon and push the "X" button

Select **System Information** and push the "X" button

The third line will be the MAC Address

Roku

From the **Home screen**, press Up to make the Menu Bar appear.

Select **Settings**.

Select **Player Info**.

Amazon Fire Stick

From the Home screen, press **Menu**.

Select **Settings**. You should see the Wi-Fi MAC Address located in the **Device Info** section.

Nintendo Switch

Select **System Settings** from the HOME Menu.

Scroll down through the menu and select **Internet**

The Nintendo Switch console's MAC address will be listed at the bottom of the screen.

Apple TV
